### **Azumah identifies 4km-long gold corridor**

**The first results from an ongoing regional auger soil sampling program at Azumah Resources' Wa-Lawra Gold Project in northwest Ghana have outlined a new 4km-long gold anomalous corridor at Basabli, 40km north of Azumah's 500,000 ounce Kunche deposit.**

The Basabli corridor is defined by several elevated gold values in excess of 0.2g/t gold and contains high spot values of up to 1.68g/t gold. The new anomalous gold corridor lies in a similar geological setting to the Kunche deposit.

The new corridor opens up a further significant exploration front for Azumah, which recently completed a 34-hole, 2,630m multi-pronged drilling program targeting three recently confirmed zones of gold mineralisation at Yagha North, Yagha South and Doggo, to the north of Kunche, as well as a coincident geochemical and geophysical anomaly at Nanga, just southwest of Kunche.

Azumah's Managing Director, Stephen Ross said the main anomaly at Basabli was very robust and the company is confident it will provide the focus for another drilling campaign in the next few months.

"As is the case at Kunche, it is coincident to the intersection of two major regional structures and proximal to the contact between sedimentary and volcanic units," Mr Ross said.

The auger soil sampling program consisted of 2,165 samples taken from a truck-mounted auger rig at depths of between 1m and 5m, providing high-quality sampling of the in-situ saprolite. The program also outlined several semi-continuous anomalies to the west of the Basabli corridor, which Azumah will infill sample as a matter of priority.

"We have just finished our second drilling campaign at Wa-Lawra this year and we are looking forward to receiving results in the coming weeks from this program, which tested gold mineralisation at Yagha North, Yagha South, Doggo North, Nanga and a prominent hill 300m east of the main Kunche gold resource," Mr Ross said.

"This recently completed program will be a precursor to further drilling later in the year at Kunche and the newly identified gold corridor to the north, with the objective of further increasing our gold resource inventory," he said.
